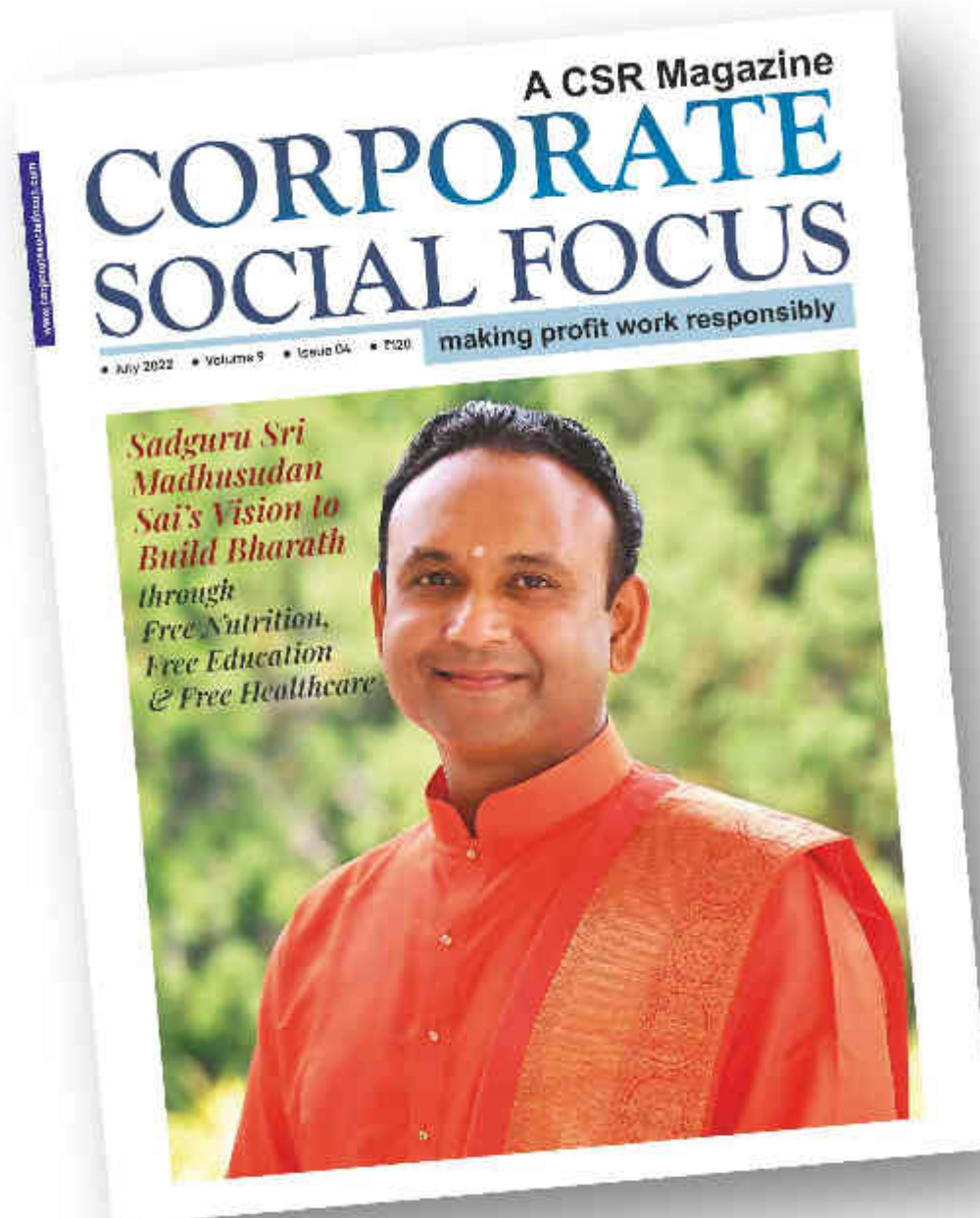

SADGURU SRI MADHUSUDAN SAI A VISIONARY ON THE MISSION OF A NEW HEALTHCARE MODEL

Founder of the World's Largest Chain of Paediatric Cardiac Hospitals Without Billing Counters

In today's progressive world where science is discovering solutions to all the problems of the society, despite its complexity, mystery and challenges; yet majority of the Indian population remains marginalised in terms of access and affordability to even some of the basic needs of living like nutrition, healthcare and education. The gap between the haves and the have-nots is a direct reflection of lack of faith in a humanitarian way of living over and above profit and production.

All it needs is a shift in thinking—a shift from I to We. Society needs examples who can show to the world that it is possible to embrace everyone with inclusivity and provide for everybody's needs, so that every child, woman, and man, irrespective of their caste, religion, race, creed, disability or health conditions have equal opportunities to live and thrive, acquire knowledge, access good healthcare and nutrition.

PAEDIATRIC CARDIAC CARE

The first heartbeat of the foetus inside a mother's womb beats about 6 weeks after gestation. Thereafter, the continuous opening and closing of the valves of the heart maintains a rhythm, with every beat reminding one of the greatest opportunity of 'Life.'

However, for a few, that rhythm is abnormal as the heart is malformed while developing in the mother's womb, and thus affects the very start to a new life. **Congenital Heart Disease (CHD)** is one of the most frequently diagnosed congenital disorders afflicting approximately 1% of live births and resulting in over 250,000 deaths annually worldwide.

The Need for Attention to CHDs

To Know – To Act

Congenital Heart Disease in children is a seldom broached topic in the healthcare spectrum, as it is often copped out as an area that has many challenges without feasible solutions. Infrastructure, cost, trained professionals, success-rate of surgeries—all of these remain a big grey area, when it comes to treating Congenital Heart Disease due to its highly complex nature.

Here is a brief analysis on the current scenario of the paediatric cardiac care in the light of CHDs

Scenario in India

- In India 9 in 1,000 children are born with CHD. 240,000 to 300,000 children are born with CHD every year
- Out of these, 60,000 children need early intervention to survive the first year of their life
- Less than 5% babies born with critical CHD, undergo surgery or any other form of life-saving intervention in India
- CHDs are the most common cause of infant mortality rate accounting for about 3-10% of infant death rates
- The paediatric cardiac care centres currently available in India are mostly in the private sector, which may not be affordable for the majority of the Indian population
- It is estimated that the cost of basic open heart CHD surgeries alone is around \$ 4,000 – 6,000 USD (INR 2.5 Lakhs to INR 4.5

Championing the cause of compassionate healthcare, Dr C Sreenivas has helped deliver free healthcare to hundreds of thousands of people in India over the course of four decades of service. After having been closely associated with Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba and His various service projects in healthcare, education and drinking water supply for over 40 years, he is presently the Chairman of the Sri Sathya Sai Health and Education Trust, which is establishing and managing the Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Centres for Child Heart Care globally, under the able leadership of Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai.

Lakhs and this would be much more based on increasing complexity of the CHD) across most private hospitals in India. While a lot of families cannot afford this, even if they make ends work, it pushes many families into a worse financial debt they may not be able to resolve

- Geographical distribution of paediatric cardiac care centres in India is very uneven. The centres that have been established over the last 15 years are in the southern states of India. But, the need is more in the Northern, Central and Eastern parts of India, which have higher birth rates and lower domestic product
- In recent years, while rate of hospital deliveries has significantly increased, pre-discharge screening of newborns by pulse oximetry for critical CHD is infrequently practised, especially in rural and semi-urban centres. These newborns with critical heart disease (critical CHD) often go home undiagnosed. Antenatal diagnosis of CHD is very low and termination of babies with CHD is high
- Total investment on the healthcare by the government is 1.4% of the gross domestic product and is one of the lowest when compared with other countries, including most developing nations
- India has only 300 paediatric cardiologists for a population of 1.39 billion with a ratio of one per 4,500,000 population. The comparison is even more dismal for paediatric cardiac surgeons. There are very few personnel qualified as paediatric cardiac intensivists, and there is no system to train them
- The total number of fellows trained (Doctorate in Medicine and Diplomate of National Board) is around 35 per year only

The Implementation

To Act and Behold

Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Centres for Child Heart Care addresses the national issue of congenital heart disease to ensure quality healthcare is made available to all, especially the underprivileged with the vision – **Right to Healthy Childhood.** Sri Sathya Sai Health & Education Trust established the completely free of cost Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Centres for Child Heart Care, starting with its **first centre in Nava Raipur in the year 2012.** Currently in India, there are three such centres: **Nava Raipur – Chhattisgarh, Palwal – Haryana, and Navi Mumbai – Maharashtra.** These are **India's largest dedicated single specialty hospitals providing world class quality paediatric cardiac services for children from both within and out of the country.**

The Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Ecosystem aims to address the burden of congenital heart diseases through a comprehensive **five-pronged approach** by focussing on **Early Diagnosis, Cure, Nutrition, Training, and Research.**

Over the last 10 years, through their diverse and holistic approach, the Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Centres have contributed significantly to resolving social issues to contribute to a more inclusive, harmonious, and prosperous world. The key drivers – **Excellence, Compassion, Collaboration, and Societal Impact** have steered the focus towards actively contributing to the national vision of 'Healthy Motherhood, Healthy Childhood.'

AN ECOSYSTEM OF HOLISTIC CARE – THE FIVE-PRONGED APPROACH

To Cure with Compassion

The three hospitals cater to about **300 children a day** and perform approximately over **450 surgeries and interventions – both invasive and non-invasive (Cath interventions) every month**—all completely free of cost. Thus far, the hospitals have treated patients from about **10,000 villages** across the length and breadth of India, and about **300 patients** from countries like Fiji, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Barbados, Nigeria, Liberia, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Afghanistan, Uzbekistan, Afghanistan, Uganda, Yemen, Ethiopia, Cameroon, Kenya, Iraq and Tanzania. **Six international child heart care missions** have been conducted in Nigeria and Fiji.

To Prevent by Early Diagnosis

Divine Mother and Child Health Program started in September 2017 to focus on preventive care for expecting mothers and rural school-going children. This is a comprehensive early detection and systemic health screening programme based on Government of India's, Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK) that focusses on the detection of **4Ds i.e., Defects at birth, Deficiencies, Diseases and Developmental delays,**

and Disabilities. As of October 2022, over 135,500 children and 66,450 expecting mothers have been screened and treated.

To Nourish with Micro-Nutrients

As a preventive step to mitigate cardiac defects and to tackle the problem of hidden hunger, **SaiSure – a Multi Nutrient Supplement Programme**, was launched in February 2019, as an attempt to address the specific nutritional needs of **expecting mothers, toddlers, pre-schoolers, and children at absolutely no cost.** SaiSure is an innovative, cost-effective, scientific and easily scalable initiative conceived with scientific inputs by a panel of specialist doctors, nutritionists and experts in public health, keeping in mind the demands of vital macronutrients and micronutrients for a healthy progeny.

To Learn and Train



Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Institute of Nursing & Allied Healthcare Sciences at Nava Raipur and **Sri Indulal Shah Centre for Training and Education** at Navi Mumbai conducts numerous academic, training and skill development programmes for doctors, nurses and allied healthcare providers to develop their skills and experience. Some of the programmes offered by these centres are:

- Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Institute of Nursing & Allied Healthcare Sciences based at the Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Centre for Child Heart Care, Nava Raipur Atal Nagar offers MSc Medical Surgical Nursing in Cardiothoracic Care
- Institutional Fellowships in Paediatric Cardiac Surgery, Paediatric Cardiac Anaesthesia and Paediatric Cardiology
- Undergraduate and Postgraduate Paediatric Cardiac Training including clinical rotations, observership and exchange programmes
- Specialised training for paramedical and technical staff (including Echo Technicians, X-Ray Technicians, Lab Technicians, OT Assistants, Physician Assistants, Physiotherapists, Perfusionists, Bio-medical Engineers etc.) in Paediatric Cardiac Sciences
- Medical Fellowship Programmes accredited to Maharashtra University of Health Sciences in Paediatric Cardiac Anaesthesia, Paediatric Cardiology, Paediatric Cardiac Surgery and Public Health Practice
- Affiliation with Nursing Colleges for clinical rotation of nurses through all departments

To Research

Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Research Centre for Congenital Heart Disease at Palwal, Haryana pursues Advanced Human Genomic Research in Congenital Heart Diseases and aims at unravelling the possible causes of this disease. This Centre also houses India's first and largest Biobank with over 5,000 samples for Congenital Heart Research.

MOTHER CARE FOR CHILD CARE

Mother for the child and child for the mother, and so it is important to nurture them both simultaneously, for one is not complete without the other, and hence caring for children without caring for their mothers is no complete care.

A motherly sensitivity towards the children who are being treated at Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Centres of Child Heart Care, ideated the concept of **Maatruchaaya – the shadow of the mother.**

Maatruchaya is an initiative of Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Hospitals, where mothers of the patients are trained to handle their children soon after their procedures. 'Mother's love is equivalent to none' and this helps the child to recover faster than usual.

Mamatva – Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Mother & Child Hospitals

Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Mother & Child Hospitals are edifices that stand for the very love of a mother – 'mamatva', as these Hospitals are called.

The first **Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Mother & Child Hospital** in the premises of Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Centre for Child Heart Care at **Nava Raipur, Atal Nagar, Chhattisgarh** was inaugurated by the **Governor of Chhattisgarh, Ms Anusuiya Uikey on 13 September 2021.** The services of this Hospital provide gynaecologist and obstetrics consultation, ultrasonography, foetal echo-cardiography, health education, provision of SaiSure nutrition supplement for expecting mothers, 24x7 maternity services, normal delivery and caesarian delivery services, NICU facility for new-borns, immunisation for children, etc.

On 18 January 2022, yet another **Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Mother & Child Hospital** commenced its outpatient services at **Yavatmal, Maharashtra** in the presence of Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai along with **Mr Om Prakash (Bachu) Kadu, Minister of State – Women and Child Development, Government of Maharashtra,** and the Chairman and Trustees of Sri Sathya Sai Health and Education Trust. This Centre is dedicated to the people of Maharashtra, and provides the entire spectrum of mother and child care, including gynaecology and

obstetrics consultation, ultrasonography, ante natal care services, well baby clinic, essential medicines, pathology, micronutrient supplementation, dietetics and counselling — and all these services are rendered Totally Free of Cost. This Hospital is a furtherance to the various screening and diagnostic outreach services undertaken by the Satchikitsa Prasarak Mandal headed by its Secretary, Mr Prakash Nandurkar in the Yavatmal district of Maharashtra.

BEYOND THE INDIAN SHORES

While the Sanjeevani Centres are serving the children of the Indian sub-continent and embracing children and mothers from nearby countries as well, there was also a great need of accessibility to quality heart care for children out and beyond the shores of India. Hence, Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai embarked on replicating the Sanjeevani model overseas.

FIJI

Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai founded the Sai Prema Foundation in Fiji in the year 2016, to execute a three-phased medicare mission in Fiji.

The first phase was the inauguration of **Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Medical Centre** in April 2018 by the **Prime Minister of Fiji Honourable Josaia Voreqe Bainimarama**. Since its inception, the Centre has served over 23,782 patients with free general and specialist medical consultations and treatments, as well as free medication in partnership with the Ministry of Health and Government of Fiji.

The second phase was the launch of South Pacific's first **Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Children's Heart Screening Centre** in April 2019. This is a free facility that offers children's heart screening using the latest-in-technology 4D General Electric Echocardiogram Machine. This centre is within the Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Medical Centre, and has so far **screened over 8,398 children** from Fiji Islands.

Three medical missions were conducted in Fiji in the year 2016, 2017 and 2019. The Sanjeevani Team from India in collaboration with the Sai Prema Foundation in Fiji successfully **operated upon 73 children** in Fiji and bestowed the precious 'Gift of Life' to them.

Is this all? The need to treat more children of Fiji was right on the face, as every year approximately 200 children in Fiji and over 2,500 children in the South Pacific are born with Congenital Heart Disease (CHD), which has led to a rise in child mortality. Hence, there was clearly a need for a hospital that can treat without a billing counter!

Thus, the final phase of the healthcare mission in Fiji was the establishment of **South Pacific's first Super Speciality Paediatric Cardiac Hospital, Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani**

Children's Hospital in April 2022. This is the largest project ever undertaken by a Non-Government Organisation (NGO) in Fiji's history. The Hospital will fill the void of absolutely no access to paediatric cardiac service in the Pacific belt, and will save the families needing to take their children overseas for paediatric heart care, which costs in excess of FJD\$100,000. The Hospital is a state-of-the-art **54-bedded facility**.

Three missions have occurred in 2022 itself.

The **Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Medical Centre in Clarksdale** was inaugurated by Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai in June 2019. Since then, the Clinic has blossomed into a caring and compassionate Medical Clinic for the underserved population in Clarksdale and its surrounding counties. Providing free medical care in the United States of America can be challenging when compared to other countries—partly due to the many regulations that need to be satisfied. The Clinic was licensed and initially started by a small group of individuals and a single physician started to see patients starting in December 2019. The clinic transitioned to a temporary telehealth model during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic in early 2020, providing services to those in need.

Currently, the Clinic provides the following services:

- Comprehensive primary medical care to medically, uninsured women of all ages, and children from birth until 18 years of age
- Any medically uninsured, male members of local organisations that have directly partnered with the Clinic, also receive medical care
- Specialty medical care for pulmonary diseases, sleep disturbances, infections, and mental health problems are provided, either through clinic visits or via telehealth virtual visits
- Gynaecological care is provided once a month through a partnership with a Mobile Women's Health Unit
- Local Cardiologist partners with the Clinic to provide free cardiac evaluation for indigent patients
- Endocrinology services are provided
- Eye care is provided through a programme supported by the American Academy of Ophthalmology that offers free basic eye care for patients for one year
- Through a medical grant, indigent patients receive free radiological services including x-rays, CT-scans, ultrasound, and MRI
- Through the Clinic, patients receive laboratory tests, prescription medications, electrocardiographs (ECGs) and sleep studies, free of charge
- Medical transportation is provided for those patients who need to visit the Clinic, be taken to referrals and/or have their radiology studies done via community outreach programmes



- The Clinic provides free annual flu and COVID vaccines to the people of Clarksdale and neighbouring cities
- Creating employment opportunities for individuals in the community

The Clinic is currently working on a partnership with a local, non-profit Dental organisation to provide free basic dental care. The Centre is planning to expand its services by providing additional specialty medical care, comprehensive school health programs, health education to the community on common medical topics, cooking sessions that educate patients about healthy choices and proper nutrition, community health fairs and developing more partnerships with non-profit organisations, regional and State health leaders to provide top-notch health care to the region.

SRI LANKA

Sri Sathya Sai Karuna Nilayam Foundation was established by Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai in February 2016 in Sri Lanka, to serve the neediest of the needy, by implementing various initiatives under the skill development, poverty alleviation, nutrition, and healthcare spheres of service. The Foundation established a completely free-of-cost **Sri Sathya Sai Karunalayam Medical Centre in August 2017** at Kirankulam in the Batticaloa province, which is home to 30,000 war widows and their children. The Medical Centre has **served about 16,000 rural patients** with high-quality and reliable treatment, till date.

While the medical centre continued its consultation and outpatient services, the Foundation recognised the need to expand its healthcare embrace to many more who needed specialised services and thereby strengthen the Government's vision of Universal Healthcare Coverage.

CHD is one of the main causes of infant deaths in Sri Lanka, and every year, around 3,000 children are born with this heart disease. Many succumb to it as surgery is prohibitively expensive. On the eastern coast of Sri Lanka, the story is even more grim, as there are no hospitals which treat children with any kind of heart anomalies.

Thus, under the guidance of Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai, a 75-bedded state-of-the-art super-speciality hospital – **Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Hospital** was established to provide equitable, free, and quality healthcare to all.

The first phase of the Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Hospital with 28 beds was inaugurated by **Mr Aravinda de Silva – Former International Sri Lankan Cricketer** in the presence of Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai on 09 August 2022. This Hospital will serve its country and lift it back on its feet during these times of the huge national crisis that it is going through. In the coming year, **Sadguru is envisaging establishing two more hospitals in Turkey and Clarksdale, Mississippi.**

KEY CHARACTERISTICS OF SANJEEVANI

- **Geographical location** of Sanjeevani centres is strategically positioned so that it caters to the majority of the needy population in the central, eastern, western and northern parts of India
- **Coverage of beneficiaries** includes all states of India and 14 developing countries
- **Completely free of cost** quality healthcare specialising in paediatric cardiac care removes all commercial strain on families. **'Healthcare is a fundamental right and not a privilege'**
- **Social Return on Investment (SROI) ratio** for the services provided by Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Centres for Child Heart Care is 16.2, meaning that 'every rupee invested on a child' generates a 'social value worth 16.2 times more', thus reiterating that the efforts to improve child health is not an expense but an Investment!
- **Comprehensive services** comprising of pre-operative diagnostic and consultation services, paediatric cardiac surgical and interventional services, intensive and post-operative care, and support services including laboratory, radiology, physiotherapy, diet and medicines are provided. One-year follow-up for all surgical patients, and food and accommodation for patient attendants for the entire hospital stay is also taken care of
- **Success Life Rate:** Sai Sanjeevani Hospitals have a success rate of 98% and these children are expected to live normal life span as that of their peers
- **Antenatal care programme** offers comprehensive services to expecting and lactating women. Over 66,000 expecting women have been provided with antenatal care by the Centres
- **'Patient Experience Teams'** help to handhold every outpatient and inpatient family through their time at Sanjeevani, with regards to information management, medical / diet counselling, admissions, post-operative care, discharge, and follow-up
- **Centres for Learning Excellence** offers fellowship training programmes in the disciplines of Paediatric Cardiology, Paediatric Cardiac Anaesthesia and Intensive Care, Paediatric Cardiac Surgery, and Public Health
- **Equality** – Sanjeevani Team consists of 46% of women employees and 41% are girl beneficiaries
- **80% of the people employed in the Sai Sanjeevani Hospitals are locals.** Sanjeevani believes in empowering the locals by hiring and training them

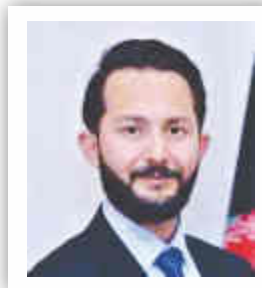

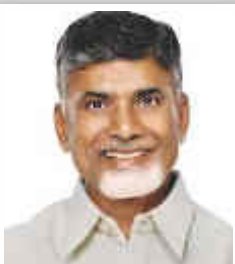

MS DAKSHITA SHARMA

A baby who spent 100 days in ICU only to return back hale and hearty to spend 100 more years of fruitful life

Date of Birth: 19 February 2015

Native: Shahpur, Hisar district, Haryana

Type of Surgery: TAPVC Repair + AV Canal Repair

Background

When Dakshita's mother was six months pregnant, sonography showed some problems related to the foetus's heart; however Dakshita was born with a weight of three kilograms—a decent weight for a healthy baby. When she turned three months old, she developed episodes of severe cold and cough. An ECHO (echocardiogram) test diagnosed her to be having a congenital heart anomaly that required an immediate surgical correction. The parents travelled to Mumbai to a large and known private facility where they were informed that the risk of a surgery on a baby as young as three months, was very high and that the surgery would cost somewhere around INR 10-20 lakhs. In fact, in most of the other hospitals, they were asked to deposit money before the intervention could begin. The family had lost all their hopes.

Treatment

The blessing in disguise came as a message in WhatsApp—it was a message about the **Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani International Centre for Child Heart Care & Research at Palwal** which promised to treat the child completely free of cost. After the consultation, the family was explained about the risk factor, yet was assured of all the efforts that they would put to do a successful surgery. The family was touched by the fact that they were informed of the risk with adequate assurance which they did not find anywhere else. Finally, the surgery was conducted in November 2015, a day after the Diwali celebrations. She had a very stormy post-operative period. Dakshita was frequently extubated and re-intubated after which she underwent a tracheostomy and could be eventually weaned off the ventilator. The family was finally ready to go home with their daughter on 08 February 2016.

Experience

Dakshita's parents spent close to three months at the hospital during which time they had become part of the Sanjeevani family. It was heartening to observe the ICU team celebrating the New Year with little Dakshita and her family in the ICU. Now, when the family reminisces about their experience, they feel that the same treatment would have cost them close to INR 30-40 Lakhs. In her father's words, *"We don't feel like returning to our home. We have received so much of love at Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Hospital which we cannot find elsewhere."*



MASTER SAIF

**From Journey-To Journey:
From Despair-To Delight**

Native: Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh

Type of Surgery: Tetralogy of Fallot (TOF)

**Background**

Little Saif hails from a village to the north of Varanasi where his father, Mr Hassan works as a motorcycle mechanic. Master Saif's heart condition came to light two years after his birth, when he fell seriously ill. The village did not have specialist doctors who could diagnose the exact heart condition and this stalled Saif's treatment for another four months after which he went to the city of Varanasi for an Echocardiogram. It is here, Mr Hassan found out about the magnitude of his child's ailment; it required a surgery which would cost 5 lakh rupees; and this was an unimaginable cost, against his monthly income of 10,000 INR.

Treatment

Good providence made Mr Hassan meet a surgeon who informed him about the **Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Centre for Child Heart at Nava Raipur Atal Nagar, Chhattisgarh**. Master Saif was diagnosed at Sai Sanjeevani and a date was given for the surgery. Being the peak of the COVID pandemic, Mr Hassan could not think of any other affordable transport than his two-wheeler, which he drove for about 16 hours covering a distance of 1,400 kilometres to reach the hospital at Raipur. Master Saif took the foremost position of prominence on the bike and braved the heavy rains to finally reach the hospital for his treatment. Little Saif underwent successful repair of Tetralogy of Fallot (TOF) and returned home again on the motorbike, only this time with a healed heart. The outward journey from Varanasi filled with uncertainties, resulted in a return journey filled with hope and delight.

**Touched By Sanjeevani, Shivam Returns To His
Homeland As A New Baby!**

Native: Nepal

**Type of Surgery: TAPVC (Total Anomalous
Pulmonary Venous Connection)**

**Background**

The COVID pandemic had wreaked havoc in many lives, and Mrs Pooja's story, the mother of Shivam, is no different. Originally based in Nepal, Pooja happened to be in Uttar Pradesh when she gave birth to her baby boy, Shivam during the COVID lockdown period. The happy tidings turned gloomy when she found that her child's heartbeat was very faint, which further led to the discovery that her baby suffered from a complex heart ailment – TAPVC (Total Anomalous Pulmonary Venous Connection), no sooner than two weeks from the baby's birth. The local doctor assured her of only a 5% survival of her child. The child appeared blue, was breathless and could not even be fed. Pooja's husband in Nepal, who hadn't even been able to come and see the baby, was equally devastated upon hearing the news of a heart ailment for his child, that needed INR 7-8 lakh for surgery. Pooja, on her own, ran pillar to post to find affordable treatment for her child, by selling her jewellery. Desperate and dejected, Pooja was unsure if she would even be able to return home with a baby in her arms.

Treatment

Like the silver lining on a cloud, **Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Centre for Child Heart Care & Training in Pediatric Cardiac Skills at Kharghar, Navi Mumbai**, came to lighten her gloom and lit up joy in her heart by treating the child 'completely free of cost'. Master Shivam received his 'Gift of Life' certificate from legendary cricketer Mr Sachin Tendulkar. Expressing her gratitude to the medical team, whom she deemed as 'Embodiments of God', Pooja hopes to raise Shivam into a heart specialist doctor and have him serve other needy children.

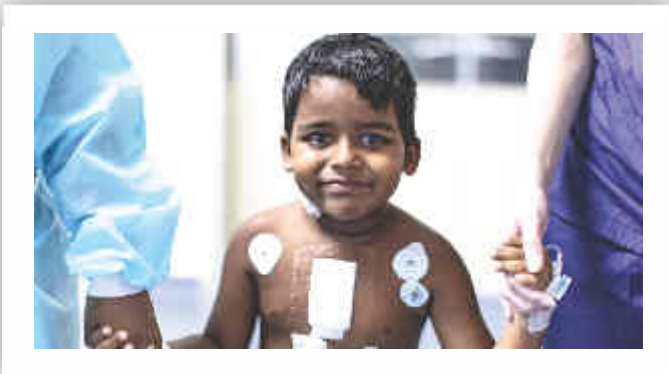
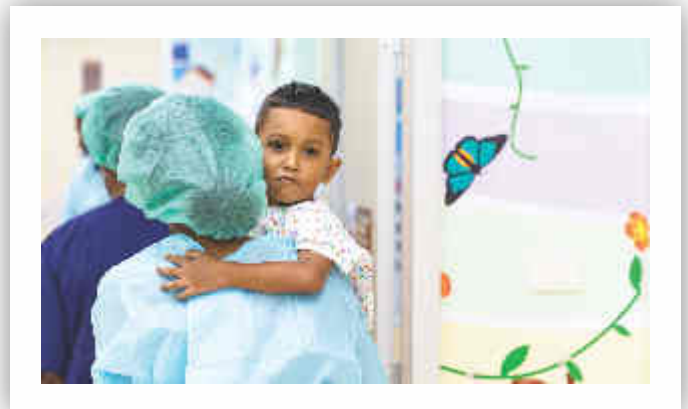
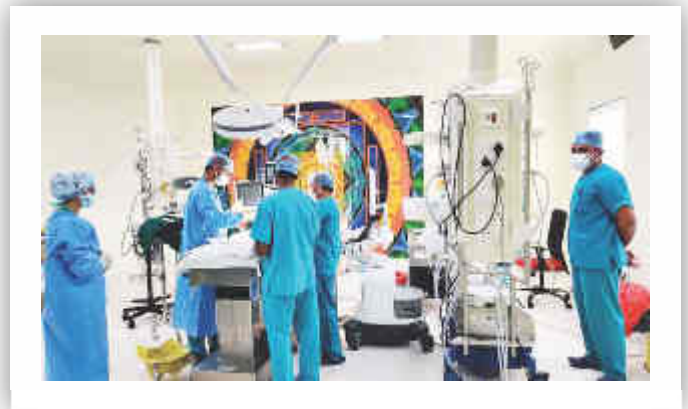
